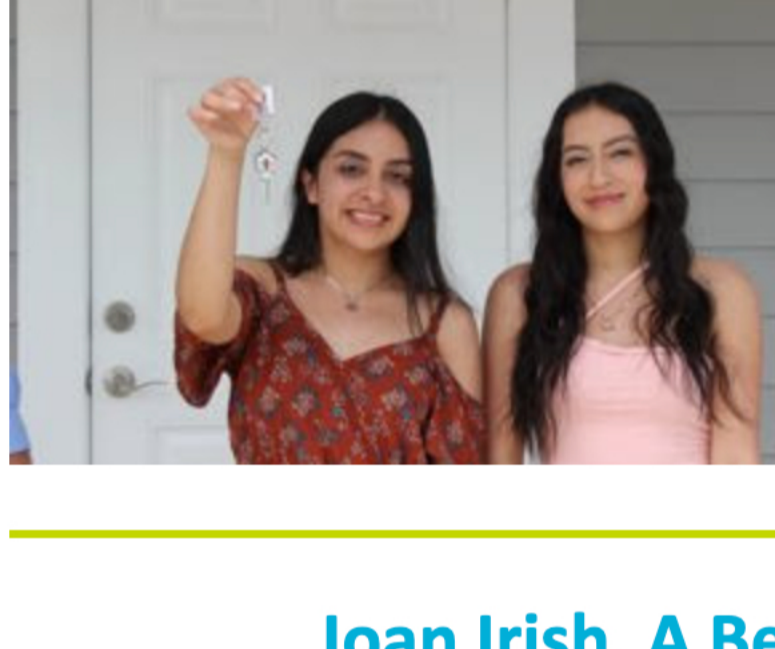

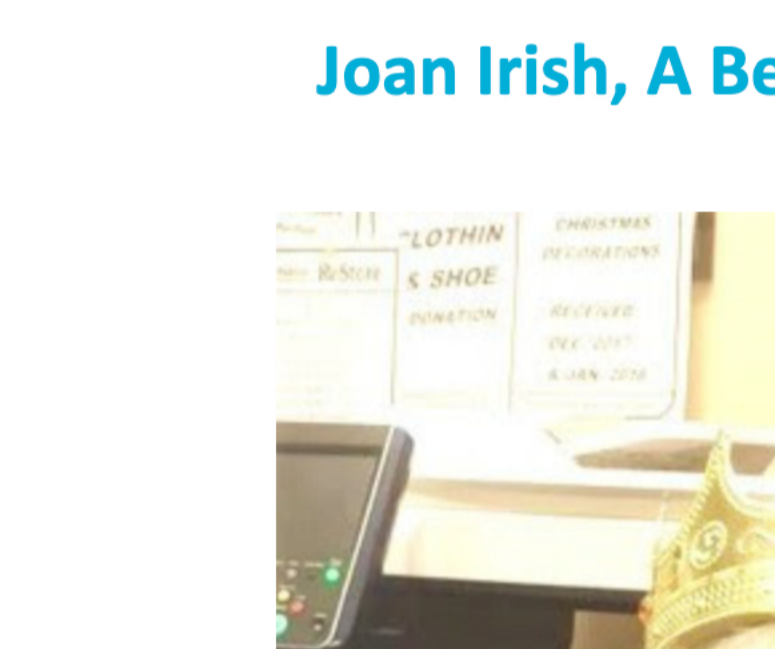

Joan Irish, A Beloved Volunteer



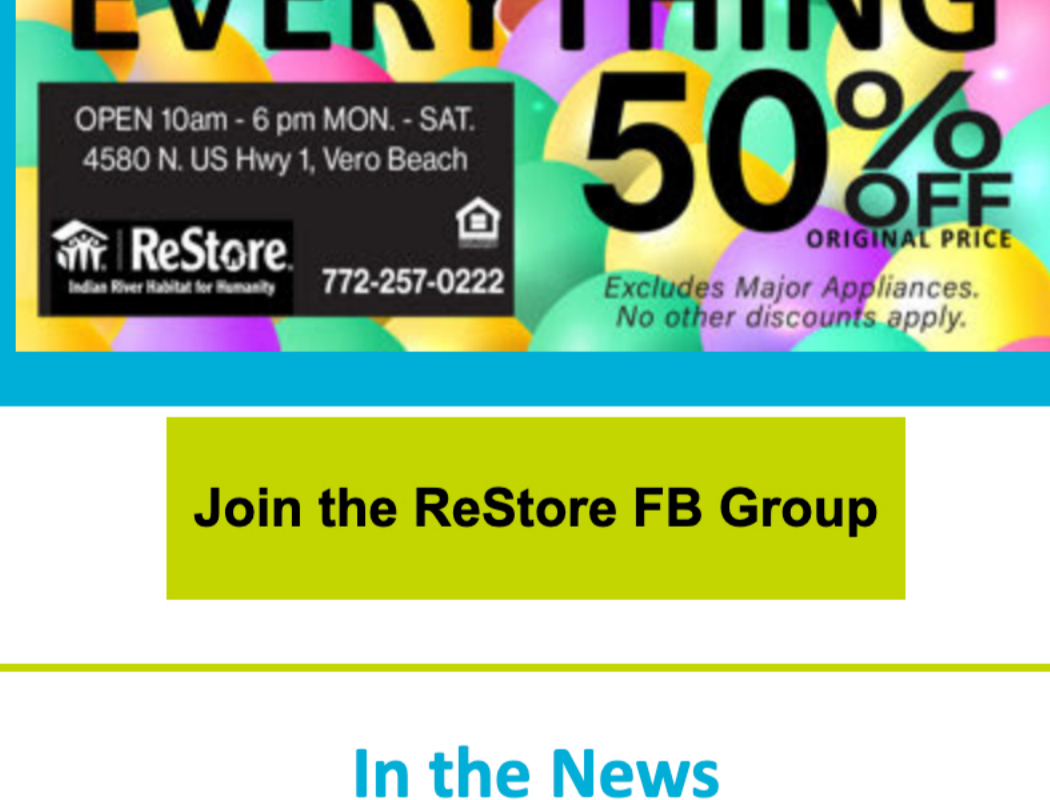
It is with great sadness that we share the news of Joan Irish's passing. She was a long-time Habitat ReStore volunteer with the Grand Harbor team.
